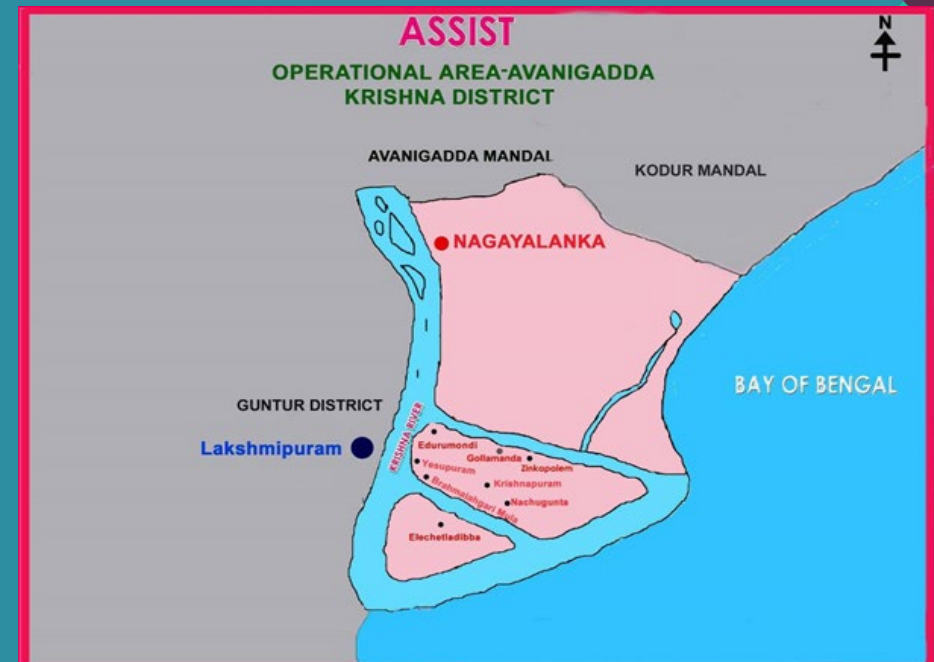
# PROJECTIONS

- Lakshmipuram comprises of 143 families with 469 people (246 male and 223 female).
- Promotion of Village Development Society and strengthening SHGs.
- Ensure all the children of 6-14 age go for schooling.
- The village owns 54 acres belonging to 41 families.
- Among 143 families, 16 families have secured shelter while 28 families are living in either incomplete houses or damaged houses.
- 99 families are living in thatched huts or temporary structures. 89 families will be provided with secured shelter along with toilet.
- 28 old houses will be renovated and fit for living along with toilet.
- Government school and community centre to be strengthened.
- Restoration of village tank with fencing and revetment.
- Household water supply through pipeline.
- Livelihood provision for 92 landless families and promotion of corpus fund at the village level covering all the 143 families.

# PROJECT GOAL

To promote the development process in Lakshmipuram through socio-educational, infrastructure and economic development

To ensure their own sustenance of the process through the formation and strengthening of Village Development Society



# PROJECT COMPONENTS



- Project period: 4 years, including:
  - 6 months of intensive education and mobilisation
  - 36 months of activity centred mobilisation
  - 6 months of tapering off and consolidation of achievements
- Project focus on 3 fields of interventions:
  - Socio-Educational Development
  - Infrastructure Development
  - Economic Development
- Activities executed locally by Village Development Society (VDS) to be formed with village-based Community Organiser





# SOCIO-EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- Village Development Society headed by 11 members (3 male and 8 female) formerly registered and strengthened through capacity building.
- Regular house visits and 16 cultural performances executed and people sensitised on development process.
- 12 SHGs with 124 women members functioning effectively.
- All the 103 children of 6-14 go for schooling.
- 13 high school going children provided with bicycles.
- 10 youth extended vocational training and 5 using learnt skill.
- 142 families raised kitchen gardens.
- 97 household washing platforms promoted.
- 10 community dust bins established.
- One family extended support to make their living after fire accident.



# INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT



- 18 families constructed new houses with Government grant and matching grant under the project.
- 23 families restored their old houses and made them secure & living.
- Village water renovated and provided fencing and four sides revetment.
- All the houses provided with piped water supply along with Government.
- 304 metres of cement concrete road established by the Government.
- Water storage overhead tank of 40,000 litres capacity is being constructed by the Government.

# ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- 40 landless families extended support to take up livelihood interventions:
  - 30 families utilized for boats and nets to fishing
  - 5 families utilized to enhance fish and prawn business
  - 5 families utilized for other units
- Revolving fund to the tune of INR 142,000- promoted in the village.
- 17 needy families extended loans from the Revolving fund to further enhance their enterprises.



# ACTION PLAN FOR 2024 & 2025



- Local Government School to be strengthened with compound wall.
- Educational material to 103 school going children.
- 45 families to be provided with household washing platforms.
- 10 youth to be extended vocational training.
- 71 deserving families to be provided with housing matching grant along with Government.
- 5 families to be supported to restore their old houses.
- Community hall to be strengthened.
- 52 landless families to be supported for livelihood interventions.
